Broadband Infrastructure

- Submitted to United States Department of Commerce NTIA BTOP
- Expands the Arkansas Telehealth Oversight and Management Network (ATOM Network) to extend clinical and educational interactive video to every Arkansan.
- Represents the efforts of 402 community anchor institutions in Arkansas.
- Creates and sustains over 30,000 jobs in Arkansas.
- Offers new skills in healthcare technology to new and existing healthcare workers.
- Affords every resident in Arkansas improved access to community anchor institution bandwidth, enhanced quality of broadband-delivered health services, and enhanced capacity to communicate and learn through interactive video technologies.
- Federal request: \$50,480,977 Required in-kind match: \$12,215,203

Sustainable Broadband Adoption

- Submitted as part of the Connect Arkansas statewide proposal
- Submitted to United States Department of Commerce NTIA BTOP
- Establishes the Arkansas Center for Telehealth (ACT)
- Promotes broadband health adoption through this outreach, education, and awareness initiative aimed at healthcare providers, administrators, and the public residing in the south's vulnerable populations.
- Delivers technology training, needs-based curricula, an educational website, awareness campaign, and 24/7 technical support.
- Federal request: \$1,342,968; Required in-kind match: \$244,176

Public Computer Centers

- Submitted as part of the Connect Arkansas statewide proposal
- Submitted to United States Department of Commerce NTIA BTOP
- Establishes Arkansas Centers for Learning in Clinical Knowledge (Arkansas CLICK)
- Provides access to health education through two public computing centers: the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences' Arkansas Center for Telehealth Training Center and the University of Arkansas Satellite Campus
- Emphasizes instruction in the use of broadband to direct healthcare modernization in the care and education of vulnerable, medically underserved populations.
- Federal request: \$3,651,982 Required in-kind match: \$724,833
